#### Principal's Report - Term 3, 2024

As I write this, we have had the Year 12 trials and students should be working on the feedback they are getting from their teachers. Even though the assessment mark component is wrapped up at this point there is still time for significant improvement in the HSC examinations. Students should be practising the areas where they have been identified as lacking knowledge or exam technique and getting feedback from their teachers. If students haven't been accessing the Senior Study Group on a Thursday afternoon they should. There are a number of Year 12 students who are attending these



regularly and gaining the benefits from it. The important thing to remember for students is that there is help available and to use the time that is left.

How exciting it is that we're actually having a school play, "Alice in Wonderland". I've been waiting for this for a while now, since before the outbreak of COVID actually, so I'm hoping the school community will get behind it. Great work by the CAPA department and their various helpers who are making it all happen and great to see so many students getting involved in what is a big team effort.

I had the pleasure of attending the opening night of "Alice in Wonderland" last night and it was fantastic. It's not too late for you to see the show. Tickets for Friday and Saturday night's performances are on sale at Trybooking.

Still a few works going on around the school. Supply problems have caused them to be a bit more drawn out then we'd like but the lifts in K and L Block, which will be for disabled students, have begun installation and should be finished by the end of the year. The work on the hall roof will begin after the HSC is finished.

Finally, can I urge our parents to be involved in our P&C meetings. They are on the Monday evening of the third and eighth weeks of each term at 7.00pm. They provide an important way for me to get feedback from our community as well as providing opportunities for our community to be involved directly on the things that are happening in the school.

Opening hours are Tuesdays between 8:30am and 11:30am, we encourage everyone to use our click and collect service, where orders are placed online and picked up in store.

We also ask when ordering online to either enter the student's name in the notes section or let the student know whose name the order is under. This would make it quicker to locate orders for pick up. An in-person service is still provided during shop opening times for exchanges and those who are unsure of sizing and would prefer to try items on before purchasing. Uniform shop can he found here.




**Old uniforms:** If you have uniforms no longer worn and in good wearable condition, you can donate them by handing them in at the school office. These items get washed and sold as second hand uniforms.

**Senior uniforms:** Now is a good time to purchase senior uniforms for current Year 9 students who will be switching from the junior uniforms to senior uniforms in 2025.

**Second hand uniforms:** Purchase of second hand uniforms can only be done in person at the uniform shop. We get second hand uniforms donated to the school from students who have left the school or who have outgrown what they have.

#### Volunteering in the canteen

With the success of the canteen's new menu, we are in need of additional volunteers for recess and lunch, especially at the end of the week. Each shift is 30 minutes, except on Tuesday when recess and lunch is 20 minutes. We would appreciate any help you can give us.

There is some admin that needs to be done before volunteering in the canteen. This only needs to be done once and is required by the school and NSW Food Authority. We'll need you to send through the following:

- Working with Children Check free to get for volunteers. Apply through <u>Service NSW</u>
- Completed <u>Food Handler Basics</u> training. This takes about an hour to complete
- Complete a declaration for child-related workers form
- Finally, a copy of your photo ID e.g. Drivers Licence

- Choose the slot(s) you can do
- Sign up!

That's it. You won't need to register an account or keep a password to Signup.

**Payment Methods:** Students can now use the school ID to pay in the canteen. This adds a 4th way to pay for food and drinks during recess and lunch. The other 3 ways are EFTPOS cards, Flexischools and cash.

**Flexischools:** <u>Flexischools</u> is the canteen ordering app and we still encourage you to sign up and place orders via the app, as it helps us better estimate how meals to prepare each day.







#### **Environment**

The edible native plant walkway is growing. Here are 3 plants you'll find along the walkway. The walkway was created by Shigeki, the School's GA and his colleagues.

Millaa Millaa: Bears orange/red edible berries that have a sharp and sweet taste. Berries mature from November through to April.

There was a great turnout at the last Working Bee, including two future HHHS students. We pruned, weeded and planted. #### TerraCycle - Writing instrument recycling

Don't forget to drop off your old or unused pens, pen caps, textas, mechanical and wooden pencils, highlighters, markers, marker caps, permanent markers, permanent marker caps, etc at the student reception area of the school office.

The sustainability organiser has set up a recycling box to collect these items. Once the box is full, it would be sent to TerraCycle for recycling or use. We also get financial compensation for what we send back.



#### **Outdoor Sports and Recreation Project**

Less socialisation and communication between peers, not having enough areas to hang out and reduced physical activities during free time is becoming the norm.

These are a few of the reasons why we are creating an area with desirable equipment that encourages socialisation and physical activity for students during free periods and by up to 30 students in support of the school's sports curriculum. Added to this, the area being created would be available as part of the Share Our Space initiative, where anyone can use the space outside of school hours.

Examples of structured and unstructured activity the area could be used for.

**Unstructured activity:** Conversation area - find a friend zone - chill out / calming down area - an area to hang out, meet new people and talk. Outside of school time, e.g. during school holidays, the space can be used by local teenagers as part of the "Share Our Space" program.

**Structured activity:** Used to complement PDHPE curriculum - Meditation space - School games - Part of our annual colour fun run course - outdoor classroom (sports) - outdoor gym

The Outdoor Sports and Recreation (OSRA) team has worked with the PDHPE department to select appropriate equipment and contacted suppliers to get quotes. All this has been handed over to the school to be submitted to State Infrastructure NSW for approval.

#### **P&C Funding to the School 2024**

Each year the P&C funds a handful of projects at the school. During term 2 each department submits what they'll like funding for and at the first P&C meeting of term 3, members vote on which ones to approve funding for.

This year we received 8 funding proposals from teachers, all of which were worthy of funding. Below are the ones members voted to be funded by the P&C this year.

- New barbeque for the school \$1,999
- Whiteboards for 2 (out of 8) maths classrooms \$9,839
- Dishwasher for hospitality (TAS) \$8,162
- New furniture for library/learning support \$20,000

#### **Fundraising**

As a not for profit organisation, we raise funds through donations, fundraising events, grants and community sponsored events.

Our next fundraising event organised by our fundraising team is the annual colour fun run. This event raises money through student sponsorship, with prizes for those who raise the most money. The HHHS Colour Fun Run will be held on Friday 27th September - the last day of Term 3. Donations can be made here and are tax deductible.

Students and staff are encouraged to dress up for the event. T-shirts, coloured sunnies and tutu's for the event will be on sale each Wednesday in September



leading up to the event and there will be a BBQ sausage sizzle on the day.

Use the app to donate refunds from eligible containers to Hunters Hill High School and ask your family and friends to do the same.





- Monitor adherence to banking and cash handling procedures



UAC Early Bird fees are also closing soon – September 30. PAY FOR YOUR UAC ACCOUNT BEFORE THIS DATE. Once payment is made, you can change your application as much and as often as you like – just pay now to avoid the fee almost tripling.

Year 10 have submitted school-based subject selections for Stage 6; counselling sessions will be happening soon. There is still a small amount of time to apply for TVET courses — September 13. Late applications are rarely successful — see Ms Polak ASAP.







