### Principal's Report – Term 3, 2024

Term 4 is here already. Teachers are already giving me Christmas lists! The year has zipped along and as I write this the HSC examinations have finished and things, for the most part, have gone smoothly. The students that I have spoken to have been pleased with their responses and their preparation. Now comes that wait for the results, although many of our students have already received early entry for university. There will be a morning tea for the Years 12s to come in and share their results on Wednesday, 18 December from 10.45am – 11.45am. We look forward to seeing them at the Morning Tea.



The school is now the biggest it's been for three decades. We are over the eight hundred mark and it looks like being a little bit more then that next year. A lot of this growth has come from in-area support with local parents choosing us over competing private schools.

Stay tuned for some updates around the start of next year. At this point we are waiting on specific advice but there has been information in the media referring to the agreement and ongoing discussions between the Department of Education and the Teachers Federation that will affect starting dates for next year. We will certainly let you know before the end of the year.

Yes, construction is still ongoing. Fortunately, the weather has been okay and we are pretty close to being on track with the lift installation in K and L block. We are expecting disabled students next year and this will be of great benefit to them obviously.

At this stage the hall will be out for a few weeks at the start of next term. The roof urgently needs replacement, which will begin immediately after our end of year presentation day in the last week of school. Once again, this is a bit weather dependent, but it should be done well in time for the school musical.

Reports will of course be available before the end of the year for Years 7-10. Can I urge parents to discuss these reports with their child. Teachers do put time and effort into them, and they do provide a guide as to what areas need to improve, whether that be a particular skill or an approach. Inevitably, some students (and parents) will be disappointed with the results, but it is only by doing something different next year do these reports go from being disappointing to successful. To accompany the Hunters Hill High School P&C Association Constitution

(HHHS P&C Version 08 Apr 2018; Adopted HHHS P&C Meeting 21 May 2018)

- The rules are made under the Constitution of Hunters Hill High School Parents and Citizens Association.
- 2. The association is formed for the benefit of the students of the school, which will;
  - (a) Participate as much as possible in the activities of the school and communicate with all members of the school community;
  - (b) Co-operate in the activities of the Federation of Parents and Citizens Associations of the New South Wales; and
  - (c) Promote the interests of public education.

3. No person will serve more than three consecutive years in the same position unless there are no nominees for the position, in which case a further three year term can be served.





#### Join an Existing Team

### **Uniform Shop**

We'll be having additional opening hours this term. Usually, the uniform shop is open on Tuesdays between 8:30am and 11:30am, we encourage everyone to use our click and collect service, where orders are placed online and picked up in store.

#### Volunteering in the Canteen

There is some admin that needs to be done before volunteering in the canteen. This only needs to be done once and is required by the school and NSW Food Authority. We'll need you to send through the following:

- Working with Children Check free to get for volunteers. Apply through Service NSW
- Completed Food Handler Basics training. This takes about an hour to complete
- Finally, you'll need to show a copy of your photo ID e.g. Drivers Licence, at the school office before the first shift

Once all the paperwork is done and sent to exec@hhhspandc.org.au signing up to volunteer in the canteen is easy.



#### **Payment methods**

#### TerraCycle - Writing instrument recycling

Don't forget to drop off your old or unused pens, pen caps, textas, mechanical and wooden pencils, highlighters, markers, marker caps, permanent markers, permanent marker caps, etc at the student reception area of the school office.

The sustainability organiser has set up a recycling box to collect these items. Once the box is full, it would be sent to TerraCycle for recycling or use. We also get financial compensation for what we send back.

### **Outdoor Sports and Recreation Project**

The Outdoor Sports and Recreation (OSRA) team has worked with the PDHPE department to select appropriate equipment and contacted suppliers to get quotes. #### **Return and Earn**



### PDHPE Report – Term 4, 2024

#### Year 7 Gala Day: Success for 9PASS coaches

The Year 7 Gala Day was a fantastic beginning to Term 4, celebrating leadership, teamwork, and the culmination of our 9PASS students' learning. Despite the intense heat, the day ran smoothly, thanks to the dedication and preparation of our Year 9 PASS class, who stepped up as coaches for the Year 7 teams.

In Term 3, the 9PASS students completed a unit of work focused on understanding the fundamentals of coaching. They explored topics such as effective communication, planning, skill development,



coaching techniques, and fostering team cohesion. The Gala Day formed part of their assessment, providing an authentic opportunity to put their theoretical knowledge into practice.

In the weeks leading up to the event, the 9PASS students held training sessions during lunchtimes with their assigned Year 7 teams. These sessions helped the coaches build relationships with their players, explain the rules of the games, and develop their teams' confidence and skills.





On the day, the Year 7 students showcased great enthusiasm and sportsmanship,

#### Year 8 Wellbeing Day: A Triumph for 10PASS2

Term 3 is always a significant milestone in the PASS program, marking the moment where students step into leadership roles and take responsibility for organising events for the junior years. Having experienced their own Gala Days as Year 7 students and later coached as Year 9s, this term was about applying those skills to create a memorable event.

### PDHPE Report – Term 4, 2024

The 10PASS2 class worked together to plan, design, and deliver the **Year 8 Wellbeing Day** in conjunction with 10PASS 3. The focus of the day was **flag football**, a sport new to most Year 8 students. To ensure the event's success, the class created specialised hubs, each responsible for a key area of the day:

- **Referees and Equipment Managers**: Ensured smooth gameplay and well-prepared resources.
- Event Organisers: Coordinated logistics and ensured everything ran on schedule, helping where needed on the day.
- **Coaches**: Taught the rules, developed the players' skills, and provided guidance. They stayed with their teams throughout the day, providing feedback, managing games and distributing awards.
- Draw Organisers and Result Keepers: Managed match schedules and recorded scores. They worked with the other 10Pass class to ensure organisation and clarity between the events.
- The Wellbeing and marketing Team: Integrated the Learning Disposition Wheel into the event, focusing on grit, teamwork, empathy, and influence. They created posters and liaised with the other 10Pass class to ensure alignment with advertising.







The Wellbeing Team played а particularly innovative role bv creating awards aligned with these game, dispositions. After each coaches discussed with players how they demonstrated these traits, involving the Year 8 students in meaningful reflections and decisionmaking.

It was incredibly rewarding to watch the Year 10 students embrace their roles with enthusiasm and professionalism. They explained the rules clearly, created an inclusive and

supportive environment, and encouraged the Year 8s to improve their skills

throughout the day. The effort and teamwork of the Year 10s were evident in the growing confidence and performance of the Year 8 players as the event progressed.

The day was a fantastic mix of competition, growth, and collaboration, and I couldn't be prouder as their teacher. Watching the Year 10 students rise to the challenge of leadership and deliver such a well-run event was a true highlight of the year. Well done to all involved!


