From The Principal

Over the past couple of weeks, it has been wonderful to observe and speak with refreshed staff and students - all of whom seemed to have benefited greatly from the recent holiday period. Our final term is always a particularly busy and fulfilling one as it is crammed with academic as well as celebratory commitments.

Apart from rest and recreation, I hope families utilised the holiday period to ensure that **school equipment and uniforms** were in order. This planning assists students to fulfil their responsibilities to their school community regarding uniform, behaviour and learning.

Of course, one of the highlights of last term was the **Graduation Assembly for Year 12 2013** - a moving and significant *rite of passage* for our Year 12 students. Students must comply with exam procedures, read questions carefully and utilise the time allowed for each exam. Students should take care to read the HSC timetable carefully and alert the Presiding Officer and the school to any illness or misadventure during the exam period.

Relieving Deputy Principal, Mr Josh Gane and Year Advisor, Ms Slavica met with **Year 11 students** on the first day of this term. Having completed their Preliminary Exams at the end of last term, students have received their marks and feedback on exam performance, adjusted their curriculum patterns and commenced their HSC program. At this month's **HSC Information Evening**, a Board of Studies' presenter will complement the information provided by the school to parents and students.

Congratulations to our **2014 School and Vice Captains**: Jane Andrews, Obadiah Williams, Brittany Roulston and Nathan May. Whilst I'm delighted with our captains, I would like to acknowledge each student who nominated for captain and spoke so compellingly at last term's Leadership Assembly. The remainder of the 2014 Leadership team will be finalised and communicated over the next few weeks.

Our **excursion to Japan** over the holiday period was a great success. Students were immersed in the country and culture, had the experience of travel and, at times, had to step out of their comfort zone. Japan Tour

Hunters Hill High School Japan Tour 2013

As the Saturday evening traffic began to engulf Sydney, an excited group of young people gathered at the Departure Gates at Kingsford Smith Airport. Our intrepid group, consisting of seventeen students and three adults, was about to embark on an amazing ten-day journey to "The Land of the Rising Sun" Japan.

After an uneventful stopover in Taipei, early on Sunday afternoon we finally arrived at Narita International Airport. The ninety-minute bus ride from the airport took us from smooth-flowing expressways into the pulsing centre of Tokyo itself. We drove over multi-level expressways and past amazing sights such as the newly completed Tokyo Skytree, the tallest building in Japan. The coach finally deposited us safely at the door of our traditional ryokan (Japanese inn).

The ryokan offered our group their first taste of traditional Japanese life; changing into slippers in the genkan, sleeping on futons on the tatami mat floors and eating spectacular homemade Japanese meals. The bathing arrangements also presented some interesting challenges! Our ryokan featured deep baths like swimming pools for soaking and relaxing after a long day's sightseeing.

Our brief stay in Tokyo meant we had a packed schedule. We actually managed to see the ancient shrine, Meiji Jingu, Harajuku (home of youth fashion) and Asakusa (old fashioned downtown





Tokyo) on our first day. The following day at Tokyo Disneyland was another day packed with exciting new experiences. .

Our first trip on the Shinkansen (bullet train), took us from Tokyo to Kyoto, the ancient capital of Japan. Our three days there seemed barely long enough to see all the wonderful historic sites, however, we did take in the Ryoanji (stone garden), Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion) and the Toei Eiga Mura: A samurai and ninja-themed film park. We also took a brilliant day-trip to the former capital of Nara.

On the next leg of our journey, we travelled deep into the heart of Wakayama prefecture to Mt. Koya, the home of Japanese Buddhism. Walking through giant groves of cedar to the ancient temples of the Shingon sect was a unique experience; we stayed the night at a local monastery and rose early to attend the prayer session held by the head monk in the adjoining temple. The Buddhist vegetarian meals were a highlight of the trip! Thanks to our dedicated tour guide, Mr Nakai, we met the next Shinkansen to our final destination, Hiroshima.

Our day trip to the famous Miyajima Island was delightful, the place famous for its 'floating torii' (shrine gate) and wandering deer, did not disappoint. We all rode the cable car to the peak of Mt. Misen,



which afforded an astonishing view of the Seto Inland Sea. After some of us hiked down the mountain, we returned to Hiroshima for our Farewell Okonomiyaki and Karaoke Party! The visit to the Peace Memorial Museum on our last morning was perhaps, the single most important destination on our trip.

Thanks to all those who followed our adventures on our Facebook page and 'liked' the photos we posted during the trip.

We returned to Sydney, footsore and a little weary, perhaps, but having shared in so many amazing experiences. Well done to all the Hunters Hill High School Japan Tourists of 2013. You were both responsive and responsible, and made all of us very proud!

SHOWCASE: National Dance Championships

Hunters Hill High School Dancing sensation!

Showcase is the one of the most innovative and progressive Dance competitions ever to be created in Australian and New Zealand history. Showcase is not an eisteddfod, showcase is a national event where competitors are part of a unique scoring system that is ranked across the whole competition against other competitors from Australian & New Zealand. Showcase attracts some of the best dance studios in the nation, all wanting to give their dance students the opportunity to grow and learn from the Showcase experience.

Two Hunters Hill High School students, Samantha Warren (Yr. 10) and Nadiyah Akbar (Yr. 9) competed at the Dee Why Regional Dance Championships on Saturday 12th October.

Samantha & Nadiyah both successfully qualified for their Duo "Turning to White" achieving the prestigious gold medal and 1st place. Nadiyah's Solo performance to "Hope There's Someone" also won her the gold and Samantha performed her solo to "Open Arms" and was equally successful in taking out the gold medal on the day. Only one other competitor received a higher award on the day.

Showcase is a Regional Dance Championship. To qualify for Nationals you need to score High Silver or above. Nadiyah and Samantha will now compete against the winners from all other States including NZ. The National Championship will be held on the Gold Coast in January.

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The Hunters Hill High School community is extremely proud of these two brilliant dancers and wish them the best of performances at the National Championships next year. Well done girls!!

Young In Art Exhibition

Hunters Hill High School once again has a strong presence at this year's Young In Art Exhibition under the talented guidance of Visual Art teachers Ms Anne Wong, Mr Daniel Dominguez and Ms Iva Slavica. The Official Opening of the 2013 Hunters Hill Young In Art Exhibition, was held on Wednesday 16 October, in the Hunters Hill Town Hall. Students, parents and family were invited to come along and look at the wonderful works presented by Hunters Hill High School and the surrounding schools.

The Young In Art Exhibition plays an important role in encouraging art among young people in our community with students, ranging in age from Kindergarten through to Year 12, from our eight local primary and high schools participating.

A Brief History: 58 Years YOUNG IN ART

Young in Art is an important and inspirational Exhibition of local school children's artworks. This special event connects the local Schools of Hunters Hill and recognises the talents of young people. This Exhibition encourages students to be creative and pursue artistic and creative endeavours.

The importance of inspiring and encouraging creativity in young people has always been known with a high calibre of judges taking the time to judge the children's section over the years. One of the judges of the first Children's Exhibition in 1956 was Jeffrey Smart a highly distinguished painter. Jeffrey Smart, AO (26 July 1921 – 20 June 2013) was an expatriate Australian painter known for his precisionist depictions of urban landscapes.

The Hunters Hill Young in Art Exhibition grew out of the annual Hunters Hill Art Exhibition, with children's works originally displayed in the nearby church hall from 1956 -1985. As the Exhibition grew over the years so did the popularity of the children's section. Eventually the children's section out-grew the church hall; and so in 1986 local school teacher Ric Hedley worked with all local schools and Council to develop a separate exhibition which has become Young in Art.

Each school is responsible for selecting from their student's works and then hanging/displaying them in the Hunters Hill Town Hall. These art works are then judged and awarded prizes in the following categories: Kindergarten, Yrs 1-2, Yrs 3-4, Yrs 5-6, Yrs 7-8, Yrs 9-10, Yrs 11-12, Group work, 3D –Ceramic and Photo/Mixed Media.

Schools taking part in the Exhibition are Hunters Hill Primary School, Villa Maria Parish School, Boronia Park Primary School, Gladesville Primary School, Marist Sisters College, **Hunters Hill High School**, St Joseph's College, and Riverside Girls High School.
