FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As our school calendar indicates, our **Year 12 students** have completed their Trial HSC and are completing their Major Works. Understandably, it is a very busy time within our school community as teachers mark papers, complete reports and guide students through this final phase of their HSC program.

Year 12 parents will receive separate and detailed information about the school's expectations and their children's commitments over the coming months. I urge parents to discuss these expectations and commitments with their children. It is crucial that all students focus on their learning as significant improvement leading up to, and during, the public exam period in October and November is possible, if this focus is maintained.

Unfortunately, I will miss Year 12 Graduation Assembly this year as I will be on leave; however, I'm confident that Mr Murphy, who will be relieving as Principal, will convey my best wishes to Year 12 and their families at this significant ceremony. Assisted by the leadership of R/Deputy Principal Mr Gane, Year Advisor Mr Pickles and our Student Leadership Team, our Year 12 students have been great school citizens and ambassadors for our school community. They will leave a very positive legacy. I look forward to speaking with Year 12 students before and during their HSC examinations next term.

Over the past couple of decades, Hunters Hill High has developed strong relationships and programs with our Partner Primary Schools. In fact, many of our past and current students have benefited from such programs as our Primary Enrichment Program (PEP), Top of the Hill, Hands on Science and Primary Band Day. Further, as you can see from Ms Riviera's piece in this newsletter, our students have had, and continue to have, some great leadership opportunities working with our primary schools.

With this rich history of collaboration and connection, the development of the **Lane Cove River Alliance** and its inaugural and very successful Professional Learning Day on our School Development Day this term have been great moments in Hunters Hill High School's history. I congratulate Learning and Support Teacher Ms Austin and Relieving Deputy Principals Mr Gane and Ms Chiew for their organisation as well as our teachers who developed and led workshops - all of which were very positively evaluated.

Currently, the school is planning and preparing for our **2017 staffing and timetable**. With Deputy Principal Mr Murphy's assistance, Ms Chiew will lead this team. At this stage, two positions have been finalised: 2017 Year 7 Advisor Ms Lenard and 2017 Year 10 Advisor Mr Skinner. Ms Lenard, who is an experienced Year Advisor, has commenced working with Ms Austin and 2017 Year 7 Deputy Principal Mr Gane to ensure the successful transition of Year 6 students into Hunters Hill High School. After much deliberation, Head Teacher English Ms Goulousis has decided to relinquish her Year Advisor's role at the conclusion of the year. To ensure a seamless transition, Mr Skinner, who has a strong knowledge of, and relationship with Year 9, has commenced working with Ms Goulousis and Year 9 students.

To build on our strong Student Welfare emphasis and expertise, there will be a Professional Learning Day for all Year Advisors early in Term 4. Have a glimpse at our 'Food for Thought' this newsletter - a great outcome for one of our inspiring students who faced some challenges!

It is our practice that there is a teacher presentation prior to each **P&C Meeting**. This month's meeting will be held on **Monday August 15 at 7pm** in the Staff Common Room and will be preceded by two presentations: Ms Wild's presentation on the P&C funded Promethean Screens and Ms Chiew's presentation on one of the Department of Education's new mandatory requirements - Validation.

As I have said on many occasions, we are particularly fortunate to have such an active and effective parent body within our school community. These teacher-led workshops are an opportunity for the school to share its work with parents so I encourage your attendance to learn more about your children's school.

Further, I urge all parents' attention to their **school accounts** which have been sent out recently. My thanks to those parents who have met their financial responsibilities to their children's education; to those parents who have overlooked this responsibility, please finalise these accounts at your earliest convenience. As you can see from this newsletter, your prompt and full payment allows the school to provide a vast array of programs and activities for your children as well as effect improvements to our grounds and infrastructure which benefit all of our children. As always, if families are experiencing financial duress, please contact the school and the matter will be managed confidentially.

Apart from Monday night's P&C Meeting, I'm looking forward to enjoying Wednesday night's **Soiree** and the upcoming **Year 12 Showcase** with as many parents and students as possible.

Deputy Principal Report

Congratulations to all involved in **Variety Night 2016**. Once again, I'd like to extend a huge thank you to Year 8 parent James Hurworth who arranged the filming of this event. Relating to school **building and maintenance projects**, I'm pleased to update the school community about the following work, which took place during the recent July school holidays:

- New carpet installed in 7 HSIE & PDHPE classrooms \$25,000
- Installation of additional aluminium bench seating surrounding the oval \$4,000
- Renovation of the Science Space \$30,000
- Renovations of the male and female Administration bathrooms \$30,000
- Repairs to external concrete surfaces of K Block \$75,000

It's also pleasing to announce that the **Library Air Conditioning Project** has concluded. This large project, valued at \$200,000 (funded by the Department of Education) now means our library is fully and automatically climate controlled throughout the year.

The ongoing project (funded by our P&C Association) to erect a **Shade Sail COLA** over the assembly area is nearing construction. This project was published as a public tender, with 9 companies responding to tender. On Thursday 21st July, HHHS selected the successful company and is now in the process of negotiating a start to construction. It is anticipated that the Shade Sail COLA will be constructed in the October School Holidays at a cost of \$57,000.

The **major upgrade to our computer network** continues this term. This upgrade will see HHHS classified as an eT4L school, which basically allows a greater level of remote management and maintenance from the Department of Education and offsite access to school servers by staff and families. As part of this project, HHHS is funding upgrades to our fibre optic cabling and creating a larger Wi-Fi network, including the School Hall and Movement Studio. I will continue to keep you updated about this exciting upgrade.

Finally, I'd like to congratulate our Under 16's Rugby League Team, for their recent performance at the Regional Rugby League Carnival at Centennial Park. It was a pleasure to coach these boys and I'm particularly proud of their sportsmanship and performance, finishing runners up in the carnival.

Deputy Principal Report

External Validation

The School Excellence Framework (SEF) was introduced into NSW public schools in 2015; the school used this framework to self-assess current school practices for the first time at the end of 2015. In August, the school will be undertaking the External Validation process which requires the provision of evidence to a panel that supports the school's judgement of its achievement in the 14 elements of the SEF. This panel then comes to the school and validates the school's judgement.



In preparation for External Validation, our school Executive Team along with other key staff members have discussed the SEF and its implications for informing, monitoring and validating our journey towards excellence. We had a 2-day collaborative planning day at the end of Term 2 where we developed evidence sets as part of the body of evidence required for the External Validation Submission. Additionally, Elena Goulousis and I have worked closely with Principal, School Leaders on annotating and refining our chosen evidence sets, which is basically the story outlining why these evidence sets are important to our school and what their impact is having.

This process has been a collaborative process, with all Senior Executive and Head Teachers making a contribution by either annotating an evidence set or collecting evidence that make up the evidence set. Our submission was assessed by Director, Sharon Sands on Thursday 4th August before submitted electronically on August 11th. On Thursday 25th August, we will host the External Panel who will ask any clarifying questions before they determine if our judgement was accurate and whether our evidence supports that judgement.

This self-assessment process is fundamental to the determination of our "next steps" in Hunters Hill High's journey towards excellence. We will use this data to inform our planning and preparation for 2017 and continue to make this school the best it can be. This is our planning board (see below), where through collaboration, professional dialogue and professional learning workshops, we have mapped out:

1. What we are trying to achieve from our 2015-2017 School Plan
2. How do we know we have achieved our desired impact?
3. Where do we need to go next?

Unapproved 'Social Events'

From time to time, unofficial 'social' events are sometimes contemplated and perhaps implemented by students. HHHS strongly discourages participation in these activities as they often lack the completeness in organisational detail that school-run programs follow as standard operating procedure.

Events run through third party providers are often expensive, with bond money and guaranteed payments required. These potentially expose the young person organisers to financial risk and others to financial loss and disappointment.

Parents and students need to be aware that the school will not 'pick up' the organisation or the financial management for such 'social events', nor supervise a 'social', nor can the school comment on whether appropriate risk management and safety procedures have been implemented. Should persons attend, they do so as private citizens for with parents' acceptance of the due responsibilities in regards to 'duty of care'.

Lane Cove River Alliance

Since late 2015 Hunters Hill High School has been a member of the Lane Cove River Alliance (LCRA). This alliance was established to build upon the already strong relationships between Hunters Hill High School, Riverside Girls High School, Hunters Hill Public School, Boronia Park Public School, Gladesville Public School, Lane Cove West Public School, Lane Cove West Public School and Greenwich Public School. Through the leadership of the strong executive team of principals and assistant principals the alliance determined a common goal from our respective school plans: to address the needs of Gifted and Talented Education for our students, particularly in the transition to high school.

After extensive planning, on Monday the 18th July Hunters Hill High School hosted over 350 primary and secondary teachers from the local public schools.

The day commenced with Sharon Sands (Director of Public Schools for the Northern Region) and Hunters Hill High School Principal Judith Felton welcoming and congratulating everyone on their commitment and dedication to excellence in Public Education. The agenda involved 3 keynote speakers: Dr Angela Chessman, Dr Sue Vasilevska and Shirley Koch. The three speakers gave expert advice for identifying gifted and talented students, outlining strategies for enriching learning experiences and maintaining a culture of academic achievement in the digital world. Teachers then had the opportunity to choose from over twenty workshops led by their colleagues which addressed a diverse range of GAT learning strategies for children in the digital generation including: technology, creative arts, visible thinking, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics), coding and animation.



The *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 22 August and 21 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday 19th August 2016**. Copies of the form and FAQs are available from the website above.

The *Partners in Learning* parent feedback survey

This term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online at home or on public computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 22 August and 21 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary however your responses are very much appreciated.






World of Maths Incursion for Year 7

Year 12: Term 3 is underway and our Year 12 students are currently undertaking their Trial HSC exams. Good Luck to all students.

In week 1 of Term, all Year 12 students who are considering applying for University were given the 2016/2017 UAC Guide. This booklet provides information on all of the courses that NSW Universities provide for the upcoming year. It also explains how students can submit their preference list for their desired courses. If any student has not received a booklet, they are available from the Careers Staffroom.

A friendly reminder to all Year 12 students, please activate your 'Students Online' account. If you are having any trouble with accessing this please go to room 216 and Mr. Kovacic can assist with this.

As our Year 12 cohort is finishing its school life fairly soon, I have been liaising with an external provider to assist in providing our Year 12 students with their RSA (Responsible Service of Alcohol) qualifications. This will give our students an opportunity to gain employment in the hospitality industry once they have completed their HSC.
