

# Overall Secondary Winner for Hunters Hill High School Young in Art Exhibition

This year Young in Art opened on Wednesday evening 25 October with student visual artwork available for viewing from the general public until Sunday October 29. This was a huge success with even more students, parents and teachers in attendance. The evening began with a primary school dance item followed by the presentation of winners. Hunters Hill High won five of the thirteen awards. The Visual Art staff, Ms. Wong and Ms. Scenna along with Head Teacher CAPA Ms. Sibley, celebrated our students' achievements.

The Hunters Hill Young in Art Exhibition grew from the annual Hunters Hill Art Exhibition. From 1956 - 1985 children's works were originally displayed in the nearby church hall. As the Exhibition grew over the years so did the popularity of the children's section. Eventually the children's section out grew the church hall, and so in 1986, a local visual arts teacher, Ric Hedley worked with the local schools and Council to develop a separate exhibition which became known as 'Young In Art'. This inspirational exhibition of local school student artwork is open to both primary and secondary students.

The importance of inspiring and encouraging creativity in young people has always been valued by the panel of judges taking the time to judge the children's section over the years. One of the judges of the first Children's Exhibition in 1956 was Jeffrey Smart AO (1921 –2013), a distinguished Australian painter and expatriate who was known for precise depictions of urban landscapes.

The 2017 Young in Art Exhibition displayed a range of talents from four major high schools including St Josephs, Riverside Girls High, Marist Sisters College and Hunters Hill High School as well as four Primary schools including Villa Maria Parish School, Boronia Park Public School and Gladesville Public School.
















#### Timetables are changing 26 November 2017 – Important information from Transport NSW

#### YEAR 7 AND 8 NETBALL NSW SCHOOLS CUP



The Netball NSW Schools Cup is an initiative by Netball NSW to provide New South Wales primary and secondary school students with the opportunity to enjoy netball in an inclusive and enjoyable environment. The Schools Cup is available to male and female students from Public, Independent and Catholic systems in Years Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine and Ten.

Now moving into its fifth year, the Netball NSW Schools Cup has grown from 3000 participants in the inaugural year, to over 9000 participants in 2016!

#### How the Schools Cup works

School teams compete in up to three (3) Phases of Schools Cup:

Phase 1: Local Day – school teams compete in a round robin carnival in their local area from March-August. Winning teams can progress to the Regional Final.

Phase 2: Regional Final – winning teams from respective Local Days come together to compete in round robin games followed by a finals series at their Regional Final held from March-August. Winning teams can progress to the State Final.

Phase 3: State Final – winning teams from the 8 respective Regional Finals come together to compete for the illustrious Netball NSW Schools Cup. The State Final is held in the last week of Term 3 at the home of Netball NSW – Genea Netball Centre.

#### HOW DOES THIS INVOLVE HUNTERS HILL HIGH SCHOOL

At the start of term 4 this year, girls from years 7 & 8 have been training in preparation for the competition in 2018. With no selection process the girls have been free to participate in training sessions which occur every Thursday morning at 7.30am

The girls are now in teams where they train and verse each other to build the skills necessary to be successful in the ALL SCHOOLS CUP next year. As well as this, allowing the State to recognise Hunters Hill High School for its talent in this area of sport.
