

The Owl House

The Owl House is a Disney cartoon show created by Dana Terrace. It tells the story of Luz Noceda as she enters a fantastical world called the Boiling Isles and explores its many magical wonders. On paper, the show has a typical, mediocre, feel-good fantasy plot, and if you don't watch past the first few episodes, the show doesn't seem to be that interesting. If you choose to endure through it, however, you see the show coming to life, becoming an enjoyable mix of detailed but digestible worldbuilding, creative character dynamics, a vocal cast with incredible emotional range, and a charming art style.

The main character, Luz Noceda, is an extremely relatable queer girl and fantasy nerd. The characters she meets in this wonderful new world such as Edalyn Clawthorne (also known as the Owl Lady) and King, Eda's 8-year-old demon roommate who's the proclaimed "King of Demons", are all of varied ethnicities, sexualities and genders. With a canonically non-binary character and an official sapphic relationship with an on-screen kiss, this show is the representation gift that keeps on giving.

While the first season is absolutely amazing, the show's stories and characters truly come to light during the second season, the finale of which was released on the 28th of May. What used to be a light-hearted fantasy with a few strong scenes has now become an intense and emotional ride with high stakes, incredible character development and a plot that grips onto you through the screen and refuses to let you go.

Pokemon Uranium is a very fun game to play, and is especially hard if you decide to do a Nuzlocke. A Nuzlocke is a challenge in which you use a set of rules to make the game harder. The rules of a Nuzlocke are:

The textures are also high in-quality, making the game very appealing to the eye.

The Pokemon designs are incredible; the attention that was clearly given to even the smallest of details is enough to blow anyone away. The colours worked well with each other and every design implemented characteristics of what that specific pokemon was based on.

One feature that makes this Pokemon fan game stand out is the Pokemon Trainer Test. The Pokemon Trainer Test is a test that the player is required to do to get their starter pokemon. The starter pokemon is decided based on the answers that they give. This feature makes the game feel more personal and adjustable based on the player.

Overall, I would give this game a 9.5 out of 10. The only reason I don't give this game a full 10 stars is because of minor performance issues when streaming or recording it.

The book follows Victoria (Tori) Spring, a girl in her final year of high school. Heartstopper fans will know our protagonist, as she is the older sister of Charlie Spring, the main character of the comics. However, unlike her brother, Tori is antisocial, pessimistic and spends way too much time in her own head. She's lonely, having no real friends that she fully connects with or who understand her. That is, until she has a chance meeting with Michael Holden, an optimist and Tori's opposite in every way.

Over the course of Solitaire, the two grow closer and start understanding each other more through their investigations of the book's main mystery. Solitaire, a mischievous group, starts to pull pranks around the school, gradually becoming more intense and dangerous. The book follows Tori's social life, mental struggles and the mystery of Solitaire, which also affects the following books by Alice Oseman, all taking place in the same universe.

Overall, this book has my personal rating of 7 out of 10. Due to this being Alice's first publication, there are many places in which the writing falls a bit short, having aspects that even Alice herself isn't happy about, such as the lack of any racial representation. However, if you can overlook the issues of this work, it's a very interesting, relatable and enjoyable read.





Immortal Jellyfish

Did you know that somewhere on our planet, an immortal animal exists? No, it's not humans (even though that would be cool), it is in fact...jellyfish! In the scientific world jellyfish are known as Turritopsis dohrnii.

How are they immortal?

The adult jellyfish (4.5 mm-wide) makes a copy of itself into a younger form (which is the juvenile polyp state) and they can make copies of themselves over and over again, effectively rendering them undying. The only known ways they can die are by getting eaten by another animal or infected with a deadly disease making them pass away.

Where can we find these creatures?

It was entirely an accident that these creatures were found. Scientists do not know where they originate from, but they're mostly found in the Atlantic Ocean and Mediterranean Sea. One of the first scientists to discover this jellyfish was Ferdinando Boero. These special creatures are increasingly found in oceans around the world, away from their habitats.

How do they migrate from the Mediterranean Sea to all over the world?

This migration is a result of ballast water being pumped out from ships to stay afloat. The jellyfish get attracted to the ballast water and are able to stay alive through that journey because of their ability to go back to their juvenile polyp state when they feel stressed or lack food. Police Dogs









